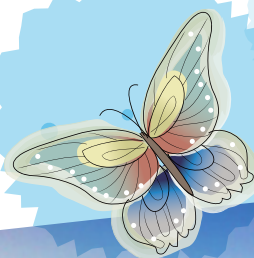

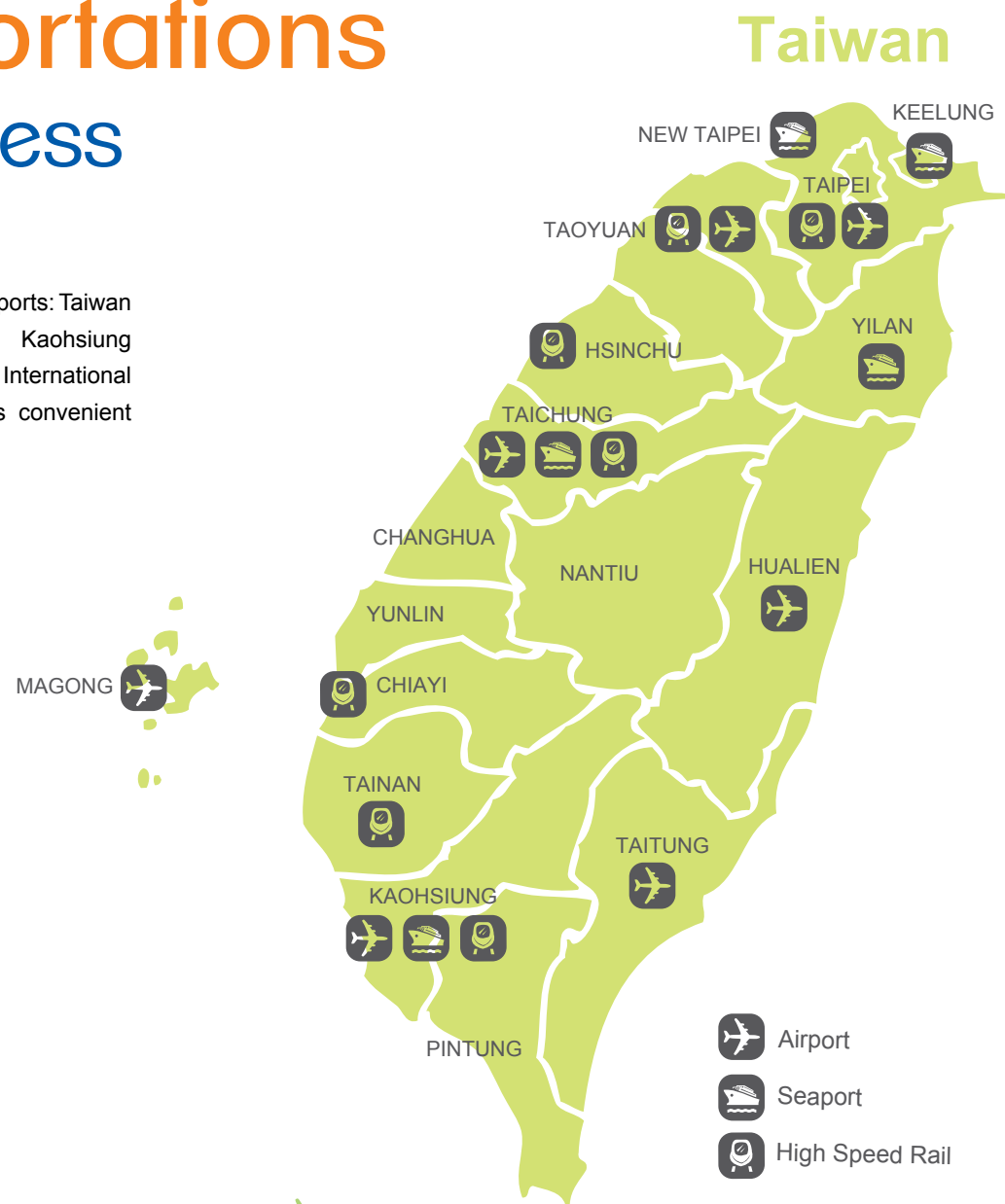

Easy Access

By Air

Taiwan has three international airports: Taiwan Taoyuan International Airport, Kaohsiung International Airport, and Taipei International (Songshan) Airport. Each offers convenient direct links to all major countries.

Getting around Taiwan

Domestic flights

Taiwan's domestic air network provides flights to link 13 additional airports, serving major centres like Taitung, Kenting, Tainan and Chiayi, as well as off-island territories such as Kinmen, Matsu, Penghu, Green Island and Orchid Island.

By Train

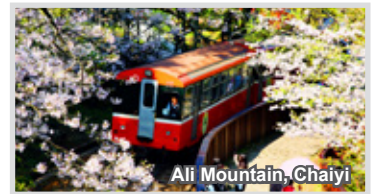


Taiwan High Speed Rail

Taiwan has an extensive and efficient transport infrastructure, making travel around the island and its cities convenient and stress free. The Taiwan High Speed Rail (THSR) covers 345 kilometres along the west side of the island, whisking passengers from Taipei in the north to Kaohsiung in the south in just 90 minutes.

Mainline Rail Network

Taiwan also has an established and extensive mainline rail network providing an inexpensive means of getting around the island. The network has stations conveniently located in the centre of cities and towns.



By Metro Systems (MRT)

The municipalities of Taipei and Kaohsiung have metro systems called the MRT, providing very cheap and convenient transport. They are rated as some of the best in the world with unparalleled levels of punctuality, reliability and cleanliness.

By Bus, Car and Taxi

Twenty-four hour bus services for long distance trips are provided by most bus companies, while overseas visitors can easily hire a car with an international driving licence. Taiwan also offers an abundance of cheap, safe and reliable taxis.



By Two Wheels

Taiwan has an island-wide cycling route network around 1,000km, inviting visitors to explore endless rolling funs on two wheels. Besides, both Taipei and Kaohsiung have developed public-use bicycles that visitors can conveniently utilize during their stay to any tourist attractions, meanwhile minimizing carbon emissions and leaving only eco-friendly footprints.



Time for Nature

At first sight of its crystalline lakes and lush gorges, it's abundantly clear why Portuguese explorers called Taiwan 'Formosa', or 'beautiful island'. Two-thirds cloaked by verdant mountains, its eight national parks offer a stunningly diverse landscape to explore, from climbable cliffs and volcanic craters to white coral beaches and tropical forests. On land or on water, it's time to discover one of nature's least-known playgrounds in Taiwan.

Taiwan has been abundantly endowed with mountains; 258 of its peaks are more than 3,000 meters high, making Taiwan geographically unique. As mountains can be found anywhere, mountain climbing is a popular leisure activity in Taiwan. The mountains on the outskirts of the city can be reached within a short time, and it can be easily combined as team building activities. In addition, there are 8 national parks and 13 national scenic areas which offer a variety of distinct topographic landscapes. These natural attractions await your discovery in Taiwan.

✈ Day 1 / Welcome to Taipei

- Transfer from Taoyuan International Airport to hotel in Taipei.
- After refreshing in your hotel, be ready for the dinner in a most reputed Taiwanese cuisine restaurant located on the 85th floor of **Taipei 101**, with the magnificent bird view of Taipei downtown.



✈ Day 2 / Full Day Discovery of Taipei, traditional and modern

- Start your day with a **Tai-Chi Class** at **Chiang-Kai-Shek Memorial Hall**. Skip the breakfast buffet in your hotel and instead experience a traditional local breakfast, such as deep fried dough sticks (youtiao) and Chinese-style flakey pastry pockets (saobing), egg pancakes (danbing) and turnip cakes (luobogao).
- Visit **Martyr's Shrine** and **National Palace Museum**. This international-class museum houses the world's largest collection of priceless Chinese art treasures, spanning China's near 5,000-year history.
- Enjoy lunch at the Grand Hotel, one of the landmarks which can be seen from afar, and reputedly the world's tallest classic-style Chinese building.
- Visit **Longshan Temple** and **Chiang Kai Shek Memorial Hall**.
- Dinner will be served at the best-known and exquisite ShangHainese dumpling restaurant.



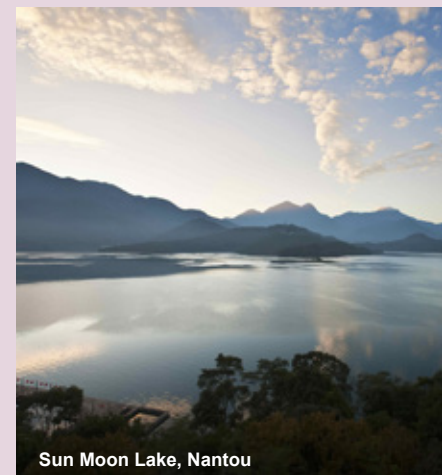
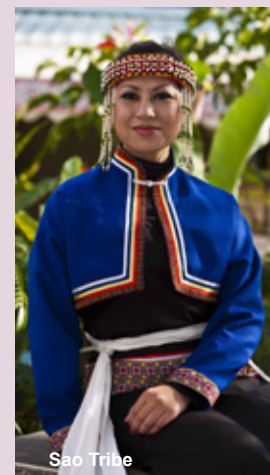
✈ Day 3 / Feel the blessing of nature from Taipei surroundings

- In the morning, visit **Dharma Drum Mountain (DDM)**, where you can find spiritual tranquility through active **meditation** and by immersing yourself in its beautiful environment.
- Onward to **Yeh-liu Geological National Park**, noted for its fantastic rock formations fashioned by the elements through the ages. A famous landmark of the park is the rock formation called the Queen's Head, which reminds many visitors of representations of the ancient Egyptian Queen Nefertiti.
- Heading to **Beitou**, one of the most highly-rated hot spring areas in Taiwan. Enjoy Kaiseki cuisine at **Beitou Museum**, built in 1921 during the Japanese colonial era. Now a Taipei historic site, the Japanese-style, two-floor wooden structure offers a fantastic dining experience with its elegant landscaped courtyard. Later, after a casual walk in the picturesque neighbourhood area, relax in the therapeutic white sulphur spring (said to be good for arthritis and dermatitis) and enjoy an ambience created by the surrounding mountains.
- Dinner for this evening will be a magnificent experience. The restaurant seems to have stepped into today's Taipei directly from the ancient Ming Dynasty.



✈ Day 4 / Discover the beauty of Sun Moon Lake

- Depart to Taichung via High Speed Railway and transfer to **Puli**, a town rich in local tradition and known for its sweet springs, delicious wine and distilled spirits, fresh flowers, and beautiful women. Lunch includes the famous **Shao-shing wine feast**.
- On arrival, you will be immediately entranced by this lake for its likeness to a Song-era landscape painting. Visit the Wen Wu Temple, Xuanzang Temple and take a **lake cruise**. The Sao Tribe that lives on the shores of Sun Moon Lake is the smallest of Taiwan's 10 aborigine tribes, with fewer than 300 families.
- Enjoy an early dinner at the **rooftop restaurant** in the hotel, with a perfect 270° panorama taking in the sunset view of Sun Moon Lake. After dinner, prepare for an exciting **aboriginal performance** and feel the vitality of this culture.



✈ Day 5 / Departure

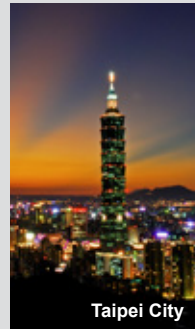

Government Support

Taiwan's MICE Industry Pilot Program (MEET TAIWAN)

In 2009, the Ministry of Economic Affairs' Bureau of Foreign Trade (BOFT) initiated the **"Taiwan MICE Advancement Program"**. A four-year development project, the program improved Taiwan's MICE industry. To advance MICE development to the next step, the BOFT is beginning an extension project titled "Taiwan's MICE Industry Pilot Program (MEET TAIWAN)". Commencing in 2013, the BOFT looks forwards to another four years of continued investment in the Taiwan MICE industry.

The MEET TAIWAN program aims to make Taiwan well-known for its high-quality service MICE industry. The long-term objective is to improve service efficiency, enhance international visibility and competitiveness of the MEET TAIWAN brand, and promote Taiwan as one of the best MICE destinations in the world.



Supports from the Central

» Bureau of Foreign Trade

To expand the scale of the MICE industry in Taiwan, the Bureau of Foreign Trade (BOFT), under the Ministry of Economic Affairs, has launched numerous projects and grants to assist organizers in the bidding, promotion and implementation stages.

Those bidding for international conventions, exhibitions and activities can apply for a subsidy of up to NTD 500,000 (about USD 16,000) per case to cover travel expenses and other related costs.

In the implementation stage, the maximum subsidy amount for international conferences is NTD 2.8 million (about USD 90,000) per case and NTD 2 million (about USD 65,000) per exhibition. The grant amount is awarded based on the number of foreign participants, venue selection, duration, and conference scale.

A travel allowance is also available for participants, limited to a total of NTD 320,000 (about USD 10,000) per event.



» Taiwan Tourism Bureau

To further encourage overseas enterprises and groups to travel to Taiwan, the Tourism bureau is offering grants and incentives such as cultural performances, planning assistance and souvenirs. In an effort to assist the business events industry, local authorities have been offering subsidies and a one stop service for event organizers in their initial consideration.

» Goal: To promote Taiwan as a premier tourism destination in Asia.

» Target: Religious, cultural or agricultural organizations, or major influential companies as determined by the Taiwan Tourism Bureau, visiting Taiwan for two nights and above.

1.For incentive tour groups representing the same company or religious, cultural or agricultural organization and arriving separately, the Taiwan Tourism Bureau will arrange cultural performances based on the total number of delegates visiting from companies or organization represented.

2.In addition to the promotions offered above, foreign companies based in Taiwan or local companies that provide incentives for 150 pax and above to visit Taiwan for the first time will also be eligible for a Welcome Dinner function and ceremony.

3.In terms of incentive tours representing major influential companies, Taiwan Tourism Bureau officials will determine the promotions eligible specifically to these delegates.

4.For all companies and organizations, the application must be received by the Taiwan Tourism Bureau at least 10 days before arrival in Taiwan. If application is received later than stated, the Taiwan Tourism Bureau has the right to refuse to provide the offers and promotions listed above.

5.For groups exceeding 251 people, please apply at least 20 days before arrival in Taiwan. If application is received later than stated, the Taiwan Tourism Bureau has the right to refuse to provide the offers and promotions listed above.

Support from Local Government

Taipei

The capital, Taipei City is the island's centre for MICE activities, offering professional organizations, convenient transportation and rich tourism resources. The city provides several subsidies to attract overseas companies to host MICE events. These include free admissions to major attractions, like the National Palace Museum, Taipei 101 Observatory, and Maokong Gondola, a sponsorship of up to NTD 1,000,000 (USD34,000) for banquets and free EasyCards, which allow travelers to tour thorough Taiwan conveniently.



Kaohsiung

Kaohsiung City, a unique harbor city in the southern Taiwan, is another ideal venue for hosting MICE activities. To support its local MICE industry, the Kaohsiung government subsidizes international congress, academic conference and exhibition up to NTD 800,000 (USD 27,000) per case. For those who apply subsidy from Kaohsiung government may obtain up to NTD 300,000 (USD 10,000) for international events.
